

**Composite: Component 1: Human Lifespan Development**

Year 10

**Why do we deliver this?**

Component 1 provides the foundation for all future learning in Health and Social Care as it looks at the development of a person across all life stages. Learners will explore different aspects of growth and development and the factors that can affect this across the life stages. They will explore the different events that can impact on individuals' physical, intellectual, emotional and social (PIES) development and how individuals cope with and are supported through changes caused by life events. Students will sit the internal assessment via a Pearson Set Assignment in Term 2 of Year 10. There is an opportunity to re-sit this component in Year 11.

**Composite: Component 2: Health and Social Care Services and Values**

Year 10

**Why do we deliver this?**

Component 2 builds on the knowledge of Component 2, by considering how different services meet the needs of individuals, with different health conditions, across different life stages. This component gives an understanding of health and social care services, and develops an understanding of the skills, attributes and values that are common across the sector (some of which are transferable to other sectors that involve interactions with clients or customers).

**Composite: Component 3: Health and Wellbeing**

Year 11

**Why do we deliver this?**

This external component builds on knowledge and understanding acquired and developed in Components 1 and 2, and includes synoptic assessment. Learners will apply their knowledge and understanding of human lifespan development and life events, sources and types of support, health and social care services, the skills, attributes and values that contribute to care and the barriers and personal obstacles to accessing services. Students will sit the external assessment at the end of the course, in the summer exam series.
